## FREE TRADE AGREEMENT BETWEEN AUSTRALIA AND PAPUA NEW GUINEA

## AGREEMENT ON TRADE AND COMMERCIAL RELATIONS BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF AUSTRALIA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA

THE GOVERNMENT OF AUSTRALIA AND THE GOVERNMENT OF PAPUA NEW GUINEA,

BEARING IN MIND the close trading and commercial relations existing between their two countries,

ACKNOWLEDGING their respective international rights and obligations,

DESIRING to maintain and strengthen trade and commercial relations between their two countries, and

HAVING RESOLVED to establish between their two countries a Free Trade Area with a view to the sustained development of their economies through expansion of trade and investment in accordance with their respective social and economic objectives,

HAVE AGREED as follows:

## Article 1

## **Definitions**

In this Agreement, unless the contrary intention appears:

<sup>&</sup>quot;Australia" means the states and the mainland territories of Australia;

<sup>&</sup>quot;free goods" means goods which when the subject of trade between the Member States are free of duties and other restrictive regulations of commerce pursuant to Article 3 of this Agreement;

<sup>&</sup>quot;Member States" means Papua New Guinea and Australia or, as the context requires, the Government of Papua New Guinea and the Government of Australia;

<sup>&</sup>quot;**primary industry**" means any industry producing, processing or marketing agricultural, livestock, fisheries or forestry products;

<sup>&</sup>quot;the Area" means the Free Trade Area established under Article 3 of this Agreement.
