ANNEX D

SCHEDULE OF SPECIFIC COMMITMENTS REPUBLIC OF KOREA

EXPLANATORY NOTES

- 1. The list of commitments below (hereinafter referred to as "this Schedule") indicates the service sectors liberalized pursuant to Article 1.6 (Schedule of Specific Commitments) and, by means of reservations, the market access and national treatment limitations that apply to services and service suppliers of Turkey in those sectors. This Schedule is composed of the following elements:
 - (a) the first column indicating the sector or sub-sector in which the commitment is undertaken by Korea, and the scope of liberalization to which the reservations apply;
 - (b) the second column describing the applicable reservations to Article 1.4 (Market Access) in the sector or subsector indicated in the first column;
 - (c) the third column describing the applicable reservations to Article 1.5 (National Treatment) in the sector or subsector indicated in the first column; and
 - (d) the fourth column describing additional commitments on measures affecting supply of services not subject to scheduling under Articles 1.4 (Market Access) and 1.5 (National Treatment).

Supply of services in sectors or subsectors covered by this Agreement and not mentioned in this Schedule is not committed.

- 2. If measures which are inconsistent with Article 1.4 (Market Access) are also inconsistent with Article 1.5 (National Treatment), such measures shall be inscribed in the column relating to Article 1.4 (Market Access) In this case the inscription will be considered to provide a condition or qualification to Articles 1.5 (National Treatment) as well.
- 3. Four different modes of supply are indicated in this Schedule. These shall be understood as follows:

- (a) The mode of supply "1) the cross-border supply" is understood as the supply of a service from the territory of a Party into the territory of the other Party, in accordance with Article 1.1.2.(a)
- (b) The mode of supply "2) the consumption abroad" is understood as the supply of a service in the territory of a Party to the service consumer of the other Party, in accordance with Article 1.1.2.(b)
- (c) The mode of supply "3) the commercial presence" is understood as the supply of a service by a service supplier of a Party throug h commercial presence in the territory of the other Party in accordance with Article 1.1.2.(c)
- (d) The mode of supply "4) the presence of natural persons" is understood as the supply of a service through the temporary presence of natural persons for business purpose, in accordance with Article 1.1.2.(d)
- 4. Notwithstanding Article 1.4 (Market Access), non-discriminatory requirements as regards the types of legal form of a commercial presence do not need to be specified in this Schedule in order to be maintained or adopted by Korea.
- 5. Korea does not undertake any commitment under paragraphs 3 and 4 in Annex A (Temporary Movement of Natural Persons for the Purpose of Supplying Services) on key personnel, graduate trainees and business service sellers in economic activities which are not liberalized pursuant to Articles 1.6 (Schedule of specific commitments).

Korea's commitment undertaken under paragraphs 3 and 4 in Annex A (Temporary Movement of Natural Persons for the Purpose of Supplying Services) on key personnel, graduate trainees and business service sellers do not apply in cases where the intent or effect of their temporary presence is to interfere with, or otherwise affect the outcome of, any labor/management dispute or negotiation.

Korea may take measures affecting natural persons seeking access to the employment market of Korea and measures regarding citizenship, residence or employment on a permanent basis.

Key personnel, graduate trainees and business service sellers whose entries and temporary stays are permitted shall observe the immigration and labor laws of Korea.

6. In identifying individual sectors and sub-sectors, CPC means the Central Products Classification as set out in Statistical Office of the UN, Statistical Papers, Series M. No. 77, CPC Prov. 1991

- 7. This Schedule does not include measures relating to qualification requirements and procedures, technical standards and licensing requirements when they do not constitute market access or national treatment limitation within the meaning of Articles 1.4 (Market Access) and 1.5 (National Treatment). Those measures (e.g. need to obtain a license, universal service obligations, need to obtain recognition of qualifications in regulated sectors, and need to pass specific examinations, including language examinations and need to have a legal domicile in the territory where the economic activity is performed), even if not listed, apply in any case to services and service suppliers of Turkey.
- 8. The rights and obligations arising from this Schedule shall have no self-executing effect and thus confer no rights directly on natural or juridical persons

The following information is provided for transparency purposes only:

- i) A foreign lawyer who wishes to practice law as a foreign legal consultant (FLC) in Korea must be approved by the Minister of Justice, must have practiced law for at least 3 years in the jurisdiction where he/she is qualified as a lawyer, and must be in good standing of the legal profession in the jurisdiction.
- ii) Permission of the Minister of Justice is required for the establishment of a representative office in Korea. The representative office consists of a FLC or FLCs approved by the Minister of Justice. It must have credibility and expertise, and sufficient capability to compensate for damages caused to the client, if any. The chief of the representative office must have practiced law for at least 7 years, including 3 years in the jurisdiction of his/her qualification.
- iii) A representative office can conduct profit-making activities provided that such presence in Korea maintains proper business plans and financial bases, and must observe the *Foreign Legal Consultant Act*, its presidential decree and enforcement rule.
- iv) For the purpose of the commitment to this sector, only the law firm which is organized under relevant law of Turkey and headquartered in Turkey can establish its representative office in Korea. Any type of subordinate or dependent legal entity, including but not limited to a branch, a local office, a subsidiary or a joint-venture firm of the law firm of a country other than Turkey shall not be permitted to establish its representative office in Korea.
- v) Korea reserves the right to adopt or maintain any measure, including but not limited to (a) restrictions on certification, approval, registration, admission, and supervision of and any other requirements with respect to, foreign country-licensed lawyers or foreign law firms supplying any type of legal services in Korea; (b) restrictions on foreign country-licensed lawyers or foreign law firms entering into partnerships, commercial associations, affiliations, or any other type of relationship regardless of legal form, with byeon-ho-sa (Korean-licensed lawyers), Korean law firms, beop-mu-sa (Korean-certified judicial scriveners), byeon-ri-sa (Korean-licensed patent attorneys), gong-in-hoe-gye-sa (Korean-certified public accountants), se-mu-sa (Korean-licensed lawyers), beop-mu-sa (Korean-certified judicial scriveners), byeon-ri-sa (Korean-licensed patent attorneys), gong-in-hoe-gye-sa (Korean-certified public accountants), se-mu-sa (Korean-certified tax accountants), or gwan-se-sa (Korean customs brokers) in Korea; and (d) restrictions on senior management and the board of directors of legal entities supplying foreign legal consulting services, including with respect to the chairman.

Modes of supply

- 1. Juridical persons supplying financial services and constituted under Korean law are subject to non-discriminatory limitations on juridical form.²³
- 2. The commitments of Korea are subject to the limitation that in order to establish or acquire a controlling interest in a financial service supplier in Korea, a foreign investor must own or control a financial service supplier that engages in supplying financial services within the same financial services sub-sector in its home country.
- 3. For greater certainty, nothing in this Agreement limits Korea's ability to require the chief executive of a financial service supplier established under its laws to reside within its territory.
- 4. For prudential reasons within the context of Annex C (Financial Services), Korea shall not be prevented from taking measures including requirements related to parent companies, the minimum capital requirement, minimum operating funds requirement, business worker's license and approval for business activities.
- 5. A financial institution must be established for only one business defined in related law and thus cannot engage in other business activities regulated by other relevant laws.
- 6. Even if Korea permits persons located in its territory, and its national wherever located, to purchase financial services from cross-border financial service suppliers of the other Party located in the territory of the other Party, such permission will not mean that Korea is required to permit such suppliers to do business or engage in solicitation in the

ATTACHMENT I

(Higher Education Services)

The types of higher educational institutions are as follows:

- 1. Junior Colleges: higher educational institutions which offer a 2-3 year curriculum and confer an associate degree, in accordance with *the Higher Education Act*.
- 2. Universities: higher educational institutions which offer a 4-6 year curriculum and confer a bachelor's degree, in accordance with *the Higher Education Act*.
- 3. Industrial Universities: higher educational institutions which offer education on the knowledge and skills needed for an industrial society, and confer a bachelor's degree, in accordance with *the Higher Education Act*.
- 4. Technical Colleges: higher educational institutions which offer a 2 year curriculum to train expert manpower, and confer

associate degrees and bachelor's degrees, in accordance with the Higher Education Act.

5. Intra-company Universities: higher educational institutions which are established and operated by employers to educate employees, and confer degrees or diplomas equivalent to those of Junior Colleges or Universities, in accordance with *the Lifelong Education Act*.

ATTACHMENT II

(Adult Education Services)

The types of adult education institutions are as follows:

- 1. Hag-won(private teaching institutes for adults) are facilities that provide tutoring services on the following subjects related to lifelong or vocational education to ten people or more for a period of 30 days or longer in accordance with the Establishment and Operation of Private Teaching Institute and Extracurricular Lessons Act. Excluded are schools, libraries, museums, workplace facilities that provide education services to employees, lifelong education facilities in accordance with the Lifelong Education Act, and driving schools.
 - (a) Industrial infrastructure technology: machinery, automobile, metal, chemicals and ceramics, electrics, telecommunications, electronics, shipbuilding, aviation, civil engineering, textile and apparels, mining resources, land development, agriculture and forestry, oceanic industry, energy, crafts, environment, transportation, and safety management
 - (b) Applied industrial technology: design, hair and cosmetology, food and beverage, packaging, printing, photography, and piano tuning
 - (c) Industrial services: stenography, computable accounting, e-commerce, job consulting, social survey, convention planning, consumer consulting, and telemarketing,
 - (d) General services: pet grooming, funeral service, hospice, flight crew, and hospital coordinators
 - (e) Computer: computers, games, robots, data processing, telecommunications equipment, the Internet, and software
 - (f) Culture and tourism: publishing, imaging and recording, film, broadcasting, character products, and tourism
 - (g) Nursing assistant: nursing assistant
 - (h) Management and office work: finance, insurance, distribution, real estate, secretary service, accounting, pen writing, bookkeeping, abacus, mental arithmetic, and speed-reading
 - (i) International: foreign languages for adults, interpretation, and translation
 - (j) Humanities: college transfer, public management, business management, accounting, statistics, and public service examination
 - (k) Arts: traditional Korean music, traditional dance, calligraphy, flower arrangement, floral art & crafts, cartoon, theatre arts, modelling, conversation skills, magic, applied music, vocal music, modern dance, baduk, and speech
 - (1) Reading room:⁴¹ reading rooms that are not related to private institutes that teach regular curricula subjects
- 2. Lifelong education facilities are the facilities which have been approved by, registered with or notified to the Ministry of Education in accordance with *the Lifelong Education Act*. Lifelong adult education facilities refer to lifelong education facilities annexed to workplaces, NGOs, schools, and media organizations, lifelong education facilities related to the development of knowledge and human resources, and on-line lifelong education facilities, all of which are established for adults.

ANNEX D

SCHEDULE OF SPECIFIC COMMITMENTS REPUBLIC OF TURKEY

EXPLANATORY NOTES

- 1. The list of commitments below (hereinafter referred to as "this Schedule") indicates the service sectors liberalized pursuant to Article 1.6 (Schedule of Specific Commitments), and, by means of reservations, the market access and national treatment limitations that apply to services and service suppliers of Korea in those sectors. This Schedule is composed of the following elements:
 - (a) the first column indicates the sector or subsector in which the commitment is undertaken by Turkey, and the scope of liberalization to which the reservations apply;
 - (b) the second column describes the applicable reservations to Article 1.4 (Market Access) in the sector or subsector indicated in the first column;
 - (c) the third column describes the applicable reservations to Article 1.5 (National Treatment) in the sector or subsector indicated in the first column; and
 - (d) the fourth column describes additional commitments on the measures affecting supply of services that are not subject to scheduling under Articles 1.4 (Market Access) and 1.5 (National Treatment).

Supply of services in sectors or subsectors covered by this Agreement and not mentioned in this Schedule is not committed.

- 2. Four different modes of supply are indicated in this Schedule. These shall be understood as follows:
 - (a) The mode of supply "1) the cross-border supply" is understood as the supply of a service from the territory of Korea into the territory of Turkey, in accordance with subparagraph 2(a) of Article 1.1 (Objective and Scope).
 - (b) The mode of supply "2) the consumption abroad" is understood as the supply of a service in the territory of Korea to a service consumer of Turkey, in accordance with subparagraph 2(b) of Article 1.1 (Objective and Scope).
 - (c) The mode of supply "3) the commercial presence" is understood as the supply of a service through a commercial presence by a Korean service supplier in the territory of Turkey, in accordance with subparagraph 2(c) of Article 1.1 (Objective and Scope).

- (d) The mode of supply "4) the presence of natural persons" is understood as the supply of a service through temporary presence in the territory of Turkey of Korean natural persons for the purpose of supplying services, in accordance with subparagraph 2(d). Article 1.1 (Objective and Scope).
- 3. Notwithstanding Article 1.4 (Market Access), non-discriminatory requirements as regards the types of legal form of a commercial presence do not need to be specified in this Schedule in order to be maintained or adopted by Turkey.
- 4. Turkey does not undertake any commitment on the entry and temporary stay of natural person categories not indicated in this schedule as well as key personnel, graduate trainees and business service sellers in economic activities which are not liberalized pursuant to Article 1.6 (Schedule of specific commitments).

Turkey's commitments undertaken under the Annex A (Temporary Movement of Natural Persons for the Purpose of Supplying Services) on key personnel, graduate trainees and business service sellers do not apply in cases where the intent or effect of their temporary presence is to interfere with, or otherwise affect the outcome of, any labor/management dispute or negotiation.

Key personnel, graduate trainees and business service sellers whose entry and temporary stay are permitted shall observe the immigration and labor laws of Turkey.

5. In identifying individual sectors and sub-sectors, where specified, CPC means the Central Product Classification as set out in Statistical Office of the United Nations, Statistical Papers, Series M, No. 77, CPC Prov, 1991. A CPC code accompanied with double asterisks "**" indicate that "part of" the sector is covered.

The ordering of the service sectors, sub-sectors and activities in this Schedule reflects the Services Sectoral Classification List contained in the WTO document MTN.GNS/W/120, dated 10 July 1991.

6. This Schedule does not include measures relating to qualification requirements and procedures, technical standards and licensing requirements when they do not constitute a market access or a national treatment limitation within the meaning of Articles 1.4 (Market Access) and 1.5 (National Treatment). Those measures (e.g. need to obtain a license, universal service obligations, need to obtain recognition of qualifications in regulated sectors, and need to pass specific examinations, including language examinations and need to have a legal domicile in the territory where the economic activity is performed), even if not listed, apply in any case to services and service suppliers of Korea.

The conditions and criteria indicated in this schedule that are required for becoming a member to the related professional chambers do not limit market access or qualify national treatment limitations within the scope of Articles 1.4 (Market Access) and 1.5 (National Treatment).

- 7. In accordance with paragraph 5 of Article 1.1 (Objective and Scope), this Schedule does not include measures concerning subsidies or grants provided by Turkey, including government-supported loans, guarantees and insurance, or any conditions attached to the receipt of such subsidies or grants, whether or not such subsidies or grants are offered exclusively to domestic services, service consumers or service suppliers.
- 8. The rights and obligations arising from this Schedule shall have no self-executing effect and thus confer no rights directly on natural or juridical persons.
